sportMoray Club Network Workshops

There are a number of 'key topics' relating to volunteers and the operation of sports clubs/physical activity groups that are high profile at present. Due to this sportMoray (local sports council) has organised a Club Network Evening to take place on Thurs 26th April as well as some supplementary workshops in Feb and May.

These workshops/events are FREE to sports clubs affiliated to sportMoray and school staff. For unaffiliated sports clubs it will cost £5 per person per workshop, payment on the night. Clubs can affiliate to sportMoray for £15 prior to the event where they could then access these workshops for free.

As well as workshops taking place at Moray College on the 26th April, there will also be a networking, promotional info area in relation to sport/physical activity in Moray and an opportunity to speak to professionals and expert volunteers.

General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) Changes - Ordered Co Ltd provide advice for all types & sizes of organisations regarding data protection compliance. PVG & Signatory Training – Volunteer Scotland will deliver this workshop to provide clubs with an introduction to the PVG legislation, the legal responsibilities in relation to PVG within your club, the requirements of being a signatory for your club and the process in relation to making a referral.

D&A Sports Development Ltd – There is growing recognition that the conditions for sporting success are born from good governance and infrastructure development within a club. D&A Sports Development provides a variety of direct specialist support services for professional and community sports clubs looking to progress their club, sport or place at the heart of their communities. Alan is also an expert on funding and income generation therefore he will focus on these areas within his presentation and share and identify appropriate funds.

Community Asset Transfer (CAT) – Andrew Gray from Moray Council will provide information on the CAT process if a sports club were interested in acquiring an asset from the Council. Danny Bisland will provide examples of how the SFA have supported football clubs with the CAT process and provide information on the legal structures and the community engagement requirements in relation to asset transfer.

Sports Psychology – It is well known that exercise has many benefits to our mental health and wellbeing. June Smith from Sporting Mind will be available to speak informally and network with clubs throughout the Club Network evening on the 29th April. June will be able to offer services to clubs on sports psychology, motivation, confidence and stress management.

School of Tennis programme – Forres Academy is one of only 40 schools across the whole of the UK this academic year to access Tennis Foundation's innovative secondary schools programme, School of Tennis. This major programme changes the way tennis is delivered in secondary schools to make it more engaging and also develops stronger links between the school and the local tennis club. The school receives funding to implement this programme. Ann will present information on the process required in relation to this programme to interested schools/tennis clubs and it will highlight the importance of networking and partnership opportunities in a local context.

Sports Club Accreditation – The 'general health' of a sports club is vitally important if it is going to be sustainable long-term. This workshop will cover the key areas that clubs should be implementing in relation to club profile, membership and accreditation, club management, equity and ethics, coaching programme and duty of care and child protection.

Social Media Guidelines – Social media continues to grow in popularity and can provide sports clubs/groups with a wide range of benefits. This workshop is designed to provide helpful, practical advice to individuals within sport which can help keep you and the club safe online.
